## WHY DOES DFI NEED 3 ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS?

For our educational events, Deep Foundations Institute provides general professional development hours (PDHs) to each attendee. We also provide PDHs for the states of New York and Florida, through licensing agencies in those states.

The Practicing Institute of Engineering in New York requires presentations to be approved for PDHs to be accompanied by three learning assessment questions. Answers are not required. Presenters will also have an open Question & Answer session at the end of their presentation.

The three questions can be True/False, Yes/No, short-answer, multiple choice or fill-in-the-blank. Here are a few examples:

- Example 1. Are micropiles a viable solution for variable ground conditions containing glacial till with boulders? Why?
- Example 2. Were performance or prescriptive specifications used on this project?
- Example 3. According to the 2015 Geotechnical Engineering Circular #7, a Hollow Bar Soil nail can best be protected against corrosion by which of the following approaches?
  - a) Epoxy Coated
  - b) Encapsulation
  - c) Sacrificial Steel
  - d) Galvanizing
  - e) Will a soil nail wall move?
- Example 4. True or False: All permanent anchors should have Class I corrosion protection.
